July 8th—It's A New Year! Club Assembly with President James Gouty

New Club President James Gouty called meeting to order with a new beginning of lighting a candle to represent Light up Rotary, our new motto. We then greeted each other, said pledge of allegiance, and had invocation.

President Gouty then taught the club the "Happy Clap" so we could welcome the District Gov Patrick Eakes when he attends our meeting on the 29th.

President Gouty proceeded with the program which consisted of coming changes for the club and challenges ahead and club goals to be obtained. He announced the new committees and the new arrangements for the committees.

There are now only five committees:

- (1) Club Administration with Dave Craven as chairman. This includes programs, attendance, club fellowship & family of rotary, District Conference & involvement.
- (2) Membership with John Grey as chairman. This includes recruitment, retention, orientation, education, & diversity.
- (3) Service Projects with Mary Joan Pugh as chairman. This includes vocation/community projects such as our dictionary program, and stop hunger now, etc. Also international, new generations, fundraising, scholarships, and athletics.
- (4) Rotary Foundation with Rob Reese as chairman. This includes our projects of polio plus, world community service, fundraising, grants, etc.
- (5) Public Relations committee with Trudy Jones as chairman. This includes our media relations, advertising and marketing, web and social media, club communications, and public image and club publicity.

James then went over the club goals to strive for in 2014-15 as listed below:

- ◆ Recruit at least two members from the club or two non-Rotarians to attend 10-20-14 Sandler Training Polio Fundraiser OR obtain a sponsor the event for at least \$500.
- ◆ Have at least the lesser of 15% of club membership or 12 people attend 11-6-14 Rotary Foundation Banquet. This may include members and guests.
- ◆ Arrange for (at least) a second Rotary Foundation club program by 4-1-15
- ◆ Club maintains or restores true 100% Paul Harris Fellow Club status by 4-1-15.
- ◆ Club becomes a new Triple Crown club by 4-1-15.
- ◆ Club adds new Paul Harris Society member by 4-1-15.
- ◆ Club adds new Bequest Society member by 4-1-15.
- ◆ Club commits to achieve EREY and/or 100% sustaining status by 6-1-15.
- ◆ Achieve club Rotary Foundation Goals, including polio plus goals, by 6-1-15
- ◆ Club commits to achieve a 10% increase in Annual Fund giving vs 2014-2014 by 6-1-15.
- ◆ Collaborate with another club(s) for a District or Global grant and complete all reports by deadline.
- ◆ Nominate a Rotary Scholar or Peach Fellow candidate.
- ◆ If a club contributes at least \$250 per member (annual Fund plus Polio Plus combined), the gold club elective criteria for the Rotary Foundation will be met.

Updated annual budget information was distributed to each member, along with a promise to keep all members informed more closely with this budget. Also any ideas for fundraising are appreciated as we are below our budgetary needs for the year and for our projects to be completed.

A picture was taken of all the new officers and board members which will be published.

Meeting ended with the Rotary Four Way Test.
